TASHKENT

- **Broadway** – walking street between independence square and Amir Timur square. The street is so-called show room for local artists and cozy place for tasting European and Uzbek cuisine.
- **Independence Square** – the main square in the country and was erected as symbol of victory over fascism in World War II. Today, its many fountains and symbolic statues which represents Uzbekistan's sovereign independence and national freedom.
- **Amir Timur Square** – also known as Tamerlane, is Uzbekistan's national hero and the most famous Central Asian conqueror. The highlight of the square is the 7-meters high statue of Amir Temur on his horse.
- **Chorsu Bazaar** – is the traditional bazaar located in Tashkent, under its blue colored domed building and the adjacent areas, where you can find all kinds of food and daily necessities that Tashkent needs.
- **Hast-Imam Mosque** – is the largest mosque in the city, it was an expensive undertaking and the interior of the blue-tiled domes is decorated with genuine gold leaf. The most important is undoubtedly the Muiy Muborak Library holds the world's oldest Qu'ran.

SAMARKAND

- **Samarkand** – the second largest city in Uzbekistan, has a history of 2,500 years and was the ancient capital of the ancient Timur Empire. As an important city on the Silk Road.
- **Mausoleum of Guri Emir** – is the tomb of Tamerlane and later became the tomb of the Timur family. It was built in 1403/04, the mausoleum is spectacular in shape, bright in color, and has a spherical cone-shaped dome. It has strong oriental Islamic architectural features and is a world-renowned Central Asian architectural treasure.
- **Registan Square** – The Registan, which literally means 'a sandy place'. The complex consists of three seminaries: Tilla-Kari Madrasah, which is also the main mosque, where prayers are held on Fridays and on holidays. On the left is the Ulugh Beg Theological Seminary (Ulugh Beg is a scholar, astronomer, poet and philosopher in the Middle Ages); Seminary; on the right is Sher-Doll (meaning Tibetan Tiger) Seminary.
- **Shah-I-Zinda Complex** – The complex is a huge burial place for noblemen of the Temurids' times. It consists of beautiful mausoleums with blue sky-like domes, mosques with painted majolica. The mausoleums was named after the cousin of the Prophet Muhammad, Kusam ibn Abbas, who was called Shakhi Zinda, which translates as "The Living King" from Persian. The legend says that Kusam ibn Abbas arrived in Samarkand for preaching of Islam, but he was killed by an arrow in one of the unbelievers' attacks.

GIJDUVAN

- **Gijduvan Ceramic School** – The ceramics depicted many stories, pictures distinguished by a geometric pattern, green and blue colors prevail in the decoration of products, reflecting the culture of each region of Uzbekistan.

BUKHARA

- **Citadel Ark** – the most ancient citadel in Bukhara dating back to the 4th century which serve as a place for several dynasties of the Bukhara Empire. Today those rooms have been transformed into small museums that hold various artifacts.
- **Samanis Mausoleum** – a real masterpiece of architecture of the 9th to 10th century located in the historical urban nucleus of the city of Bukhara, in a park laid out on the site of an ancient cemetery.
- **Bolo Hauz Mosque** – also known as the mosque of forty columns, built in honor of Bukhara governor Abu-Fayud Khan. The building served as a Friday mosque and also known as the 40-pillar mosque because the building is beautifully reflected in the pond.
- **Lyab-i Hauz Ensemble** – translated as "Edge of a pond". Lab-i Hauz survived because it is the centerpiece of a magnificent architectural ensemble. Consists of Kukeldash Madrasah and two religious edifices built by Nadir Divan-Beghi. Today, is a famous central sightseeing of Bukhara.
- **Kalyan Mosque** – the minaret of the Po-i-Kalyan mosque complex, one of the most prominent landmarks in the city. They say that when the forces of Genghis Khan entered in the city destroying everything on their way, the great commander's cap fell when he had raised the head to look round the minaret. He said: "Such great that forced me to take off the cap!" Genghis Khan gave credit for its superiority and didn't destroy.
- **Bahouddin Naqshbandi Complex** – it is a memorial complex for a famous Sufi leader and philosopher and one of the Muslim pilgrimage places for all people of the Islamic world. Sheikh Bakhaiddin Nakshbandi was one of the spiritual masters of Amir Timur. The complex consists of the mosque of Kushbegi and Muzafarohana, a courtyard with a pool, a madrasah and the burial vaults of Bukhara rulers and Dakhma, upon the tomb of Saint Bakhaiddin Naksbandi.

CHIMGAN MOUNTAIN

- **Chimgan Mountains Beldersay** – Valley of Beldersay river is very beautiful and there are wonderful views of the Big Chimgan mountain, opening from the surrounding hills.
- **Charvak Lake** – a reservoir, also a huge artificial lake with stunning blue cool water is a sight and surrounded by mountains, is a popular resort in Tashkent.
